The role of the Inclusive Ambassador is to ensure physical activity is accessible to all students, promote and inspire other students to take part, advertise and promote activity and work with staff to register students and gather feedback. We undergo training to support us with the roles and responsibilities of the job and work closely with staff.

Results from an Activity Alliance survey found the following:

- Four in five (81 per cent) disabled people would like to be more active.
- Disabled adults are twice as likely as nondisabled adults to be physically inactive (42 per cent vs 21 per cent).
- Inactivity increases with the number of impairments an individual has. 51 per cent of people with three or more impairments are inactive compared to 31 per cent of people with one impairment.



We wish to ensure at Coleg Cambria, all our activities are inclusive. Disabled students, LGBTQ+ students, student who suffer with lack of confidence or are new to exercise have the opportunities to take part in our activities. We hope to achieve this by creating safe spaces for students. Where they feel comfortable to exercise or talk with their friends.
